Artist, The, vols 31-32, Sept 1901 - Aug 1902 - MJC/17

The Artist began as an un-illustrated trade magazine published by the art suppliers and retailers William Reeves. It changed its title to The Artist and Journal of Home Culture in January 1881. In May 1894 ownership of the journal changed and it was renamed The Artist Photographer & Decorator: An Illustrated Monthly Journal of Applied Art. In January 1897 it became The Artist. An Illustrated Monthly Record of Arts, Crafts and Industries. It focused primarily on decorative art, with particular emphasis on the Arts and Crafts movement. The journal was affiliated with the Society of Designers and includes reports of their Proceedings. It also includes lengthy book reviews and regular reports on the work of art schools. Its contents focus on pattern design for wallpapers and textiles, furniture design, photography and paintings. Also included are articles on foreign architecture and art, for example 'Vienna Architecture' and 'The Paris Salons'.

Cabinet Maker and Art Furnisher was published monthly and edited by J. William Benn. It was the leading journal for the furniture and furnishing trade in Britain in the late Victorian period and is one of one of the principal sources for research on design and manufacture in this sector during these years. The focus of the journal is very much on design. It is extensively illustrated and contains numerous articles. It also includes reports on current trends, a roundup of trade news, reviews of trade literature, details of new patents, etc.

By 1890 Cabinet Maker and Art Furnisher incorporated a number of other trade publications including The Upholstery & Decorating Journal; Carpet & Floor-Covering Record; Furnishing Hardware Guide, and Timber-Yard & Woodworking Machinist.

In 1902 it changed its title to The cabinet maker & complete house furnisher, until 1962 when it changed to Cabinet maker & retail furnisher. This lasted until 1990, when it changed to Cabinet maker.

Monthly magazine published following the first world war, which reacted to the changing domestic circumstances of middle-class households where servants were now in short supply. Around the same time there was also an explosion of labour-saving devices, thanks to the expansion of the electricity network and the merits of electric irons, telephones and gramophones were discussed at length, as were ways to disguise them from view. Styling tips included decorative uses for paisley shawls. It featured a plethora of articles and advertisements on all areas of housekeeping and gardening, from heating, lighting and kitchen fixtures to furnishing the nursery, baking, choosing gifts and planting trees. The 1940s wartime issues include a monthly section entitled 'A Woman's War Time Journal'. From the 1950s onward, the magazines have a more nationalistic approach, often featuring members of the Royal family on the front cover. In 1963, Home magazine merged into Homes and Gardens.

The House Volume 11

The House was Britain's first magazine dedicated to the subject of home decoration. It was founded by John Benn, who already had a number of successful titles to his name including the Cabinet Maker, and The Furnisher and Decorator. It collapsed after five years in part because its editors adhered too closely to the ideas of design reform, advocating principles of correct taste rather than individual expression. Contemporary researchers may find this publication a good reference for information on household management and home decoration. Each volume contains an abundance of articles about good housekeeping, from cooking, hygiene and needlework to the more ambitious wood staining and scene painting. The House also contains more informative articles on the topics of art, furniture and fine art history and was published monthly as a sourcebook for the 'artistic home'. Among artists, designers and firms whose work feature in The House are Walter Crane, Liberty & Co., Heal & Sons, and John Ruskin.

The Studio began as the idea of C. Lewis Hind but he was unable to edit the magazine himself and persuaded Gleeson White to do so. Subsequently it was to become the most important British magazine about fine and applied arts of its time, featuring articles expressing contemporary opinions on the significant artists, designers and craftsmen of the day. Arthur Silver's Gesso Panel appears in the 1894 edition. It is an invaluable research tool, especially for those lesser-known artists about whom little else is written. MoDA also has a range of Studio Year Books of Decorative Art, including 'Art in England during the Elizabethan and Stuart periods', 'Old English Country Cottages', 'Modern Design in Jewellery and Fans' to 'The Art-Revival in Austria', 'The Genius of J.M.W. The Studio began as the idea of C. Lewis Hind but he was unable to edit the magazine himself and persuaded Gleeson White to do so. Subsequently it was to become the most important British magazine about fine and applied arts of its time, featuring articles expressing contemporary opinions on the significant artists, designers and craftsmen of the day. Arthur Silver's Gesso Panel appears in the 1894 edition. It is an invaluable research tool, especially for those lesser-known artists about whom little else is written. MoDA also has a range of Studio Year Books of Decorative Art, including 'Art in England during the Elizabethan and Stuart periods', 'Old English Country Cottages', 'Modern Design in Jewellery and Fans' to 'The Art-Revival in Austria', 'The Genius of J.M.W. Turner' and 'Old English Mezzotints'.

An American trade journal 'Devoted to the Upholstery Arts, Draping, Furniture, Furnishing', The Upholsterer contains a range of articles on all kinds of upholstery types from 'Made to Order Curtains' and 'Shields Used Decoratively' as well as buyer's notes and trade advertisements. From 1920 incorporates "The wall-paper news and interior decorator". The later Upholsterer and Interior Decorator was published by Clifford & Lawton, with an added emphasis on interior decoration with articles entitled 'The Decorative Silhouette' and 'The Morgan Tapestries Dispersed'.

The Wallpaper Magazine, 1927-1937 - MJC/134

Published bi- and three-monthly, this industry magazine was printed by Wall Paper Manufacturers Limited (WPM) and features advertisements, articles and information about the WPM. The WPM was founded in 1899 when many wallpaper manufacturers in the North of England amalgamated to form a 'combine'. Gradually more wallpaper factories came within the WPM and by the 1920's they held over 90% of the wallpaper market. The common brand of the WPM was 'Crown' and later in the 1930s this magazine became The Crown Wallpaper Magazine.
